CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #5: Queens Quay East Interim Improvements (Lower Jarvis to Parliament)

For the two-week period from October 24 to November 7, 2014

PROJECT SCOPE

The construction of a new Martin Goodman Trail and sidewalk on the south side of Queens Quay is underway. Over the next two weeks, crews will be working as follows:

Zone 1 – Lower Jarvis Street to Dockside Drive:

Granite installation at the head of the Jarvis Slip will be finished by October 30, 2014. Once the granite installation is complete, pedestrians will be routed onto the newly installed granite so that crews can begin the construction of the new sidewalk and Martin Goodman Trail between Lower Jarvis Street and Dockside Drive. During this phase of work, which is expected to be complete in late November, cyclists will be required to share the road with vehicular traffic.

Zone 3 – Bonnycastle Street to Small Street

Work continues on the installation of the granular base required for the construction of the new sidewalk and Martin Goodman Trail in this area. Crews will also begin the installation of cast-in-place curbs and sidewalks.

Zone 4 – Small Street to Parliament Street

The removal of hard and soft surfaces and installation of granular is ongoing. Over the next two weeks crews will begin the installation of cast-in-place curbs and the new sidewalk. Asphalt paving for the Martin Goodman Trail is also expected to begin.

Zone 5 – Parliament Street & Lakeshore Boulevard crosswalk work

Crews expect to begin the construction of a new crosswalk along the east side of the Lakeshore Blvd/Parliament St. intersection. Work will begin with the demolition – and reconstruction – of the middle island followed by new curbs.

Pedestrian, Cyclist and Vehicular Access

The eastbound curb lane will be closed to cyclist and vehicular traffic between Small Street and Parliament Street. Cyclists and vehicles will be required to share the remaining eastbound lane of traffic. Pedestrian access east of Lower Sherbourne to Lake Shore Blvd will be closed on the south side of Queens Quay, please use the north sidewalk in this area. Signage will be in place for any required pedestrian diversions.

Municipal Services Work

Municipal services work is underway to support new developments in East Bayfront including Bayside and Monde. The majority of work is occurring along Bonnycastle Street / Queens Quay East. The construction of new sewers on Queens Quay/Lake Shore from Bonnycastle to Cherry Street is expected to commence shortly. Traffic diversions will be required to accommodate the construction of the new sewers located within the road.
