**CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #18: Queens Quay Revitalization
Stage One: Week of October 1 to October 5, 2012**

WATERFRONT TORONTO/EASTERN CONSTRUCTION

Crews will continue to mobilize in preparation for the demolition of the TTC corridor from just west of Bay Street (portal) to just east of Lower Spadina Avenue. Equipment will be moved onto the site and fencing will be erected. Crews have also called for "locates" to identify gas, electrical, water and other services in and around the work and demolition areas. The demolition is expected to begin the week of October 9.

TORONTO HYDRO

Toronto Hydro continues its pre-construction activities in advance of dewatering. This includes drilling test pits and bore holes (4" in diameter) at strategic points along Queens Quay. In mid-October, Hydro will begin installing its dewatering equipment directly in front of the Westin Hotel.

BELL

Expertech will continue splicing - or connecting - newly installed copper & fibre cables in the telecom rooms at 207 and 235 Queens Quay. They will also begin splicing for 200 Queens Quay and 20 Lower Spadina once the necessary access arrangements made. There will be no impact to pedestrian or vehicular access with any splicing work. Expertech will also continue its work on the north side of Queens Quay at seven different manhole locations. Crews will pull new cables to one manhole at a time from their truck which will be parked in the westbound curb lane adjacent to the sidewalk.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

Traffic barrels and security cones will be placed around each work zone. There will be minimal pedestrian disruption as crews will be predominately working from the adjacent traffic lane. One section of the westbound traffic lane will be closed to vehicular traffic at each location. Paid duty police officers will be on site as necessary to direct traffic.

TTC

Work continues within the Harbourfront Portal. There is little or no disruption to vehicle access along Queens Quay.

LOOK AHEAD: UPCOMING WORK

- Eastern/Waterfront Toronto: The demolition of the TTC corridor is expected to begin the week of October 9. Two-way traffic will continue on Queens Quay but localized lane reductions should be expected. More information will be provided in next week's notice.
- Hydro: Preconstruction activities will continue to prepare for dewatering.
- Bell: Cabling & splicing activities will continue.
- TTC: Construction and remediation work will continue in the Harbourfront Portal.
