

Transportation Routing During Stage 1 Construction

Fall 2012 – Summer 2013

During this stage of construction, traffic moves one-way westbound with temporary TTC bus service.

TOUR BUS DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

Coaches may continue to operate short-term drop-off and pick-up from the curb, just east of Lower Simcoe Street. Coaches may also use the southbound lanes of north-south streets for short-term drop-off and pick-up.

PEDESTRIAN ACCESS

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. When work is occurring on the sidewalk, safe pedestrian passageways will be set up to divert pedestrians north or south of the construction area.

TTC

There will always be TTC service on Queens Quay. The 509 replacement bus travels south from Union Station on Bay St. and one way westbound on Queens Quay to Exhibition. Eastbound service will run on Lake Shore Blvd./Harbour St. to Bay St. where it will travel north to Union Station. Westbound stops on Queens Quay are at Bay, York, Simcoe, Rees and Spadina. Eastbound stops are on Lake Shore Blvd at Stadium, Bathurst, Dan Leckie, Spadina, Simcoe and Bay St.

VEHICULAR TRAFFIC

Vehicular traffic is one-way westbound on Queens Quay between Bay St. and Lower Spadina Ave. All driveways and north-south streets will remain open and accessible. Eastbound traffic will be diverted north on Lower Spadina Ave. to Lake Shore Blvd./Harbour St. Eastbound traffic will not be permitted between Lower Spadina Ave. and Bay St.

CYCLIST ACCESS

The detour cyclist route – an asphalt trail located in the boulevard area on the south side of Lake Shore between Lower Spadina Ave. and York St. – will enable cyclists to bypass most of the construction area. Cyclists may use this route for either eastbound or westbound travel. Westbound cyclists may also ride alongside vehicular traffic through the construction zone. Appropriate signage and pavement markings will direct cyclists through the area.
