CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #3: Queens Quay East Interim Improvements (Lower Jarvis to Parliament)

For the two-week period from September 25 to October 9, 2014

PROJECT SCOPE

The construction of interim improvements for pedestrians and cyclists is underway in East Bayfront. This includes a new Martin Goodman Trail and sidewalk on the south side of Queens Quay. Over the next two weeks, crews will be as follows:

Zone 1 – Lower Jarvis Street to Dockside Drive:

- Granite installation at the head of the Jarvis Slip is underway. This work will continue over the next two weeks. During this time pedestrian and cycling access along Queens Quay will not be affected.

Zone 3 – Bonnycastle Street to Small Street

- Work in this area has been postponed due to continuing Toronto Hydro construction in the area. The demolition of the current south side curb and asphalt surfaces will begin once Hydro crews complete their activities– currently scheduled for the week of September 30.

Zone 4 – Small Street to Parliament Street

- The existing rails and ties have been removed from the area.
- Over the next two weeks, crews will begin the removal of the existing hard and soft surfaces followed by the installation of the new sub-base for the new sidewalk and trail.

Zone 5 – Parliament Street & Lakeshore Boulevard crosswalk work

- Construction works will commence at the Lakeshore East Blvd and Parliament St. intersection. This will include the removal of hard surfaces and line painting.
- Over the next two weeks, crews will begin the installation of concrete curbs and the new sidewalk and asphalt paving.

Municipal services work is also underway to support new developments in East Bayfront including Bayside and Monde. The majority of work for these projects is occurring along Bonnycastle Street which is currently closed to traffic. Crews are also working on new watermain connections in the roadway at entrance to the new Bayside Development (between Bonnycastle and Small Streets).

Pedestrian, Cyclist and Vehicular Access

The eastbound curb lane will be closed to cyclist and vehicular traffic between Small Street and Parliament Street. Cyclists and vehicles will be required to share the remaining eastbound lane of traffic. Pedestrian access east of Lower Sherbourne to Lake Shore Blvd will be closed on the south side of Queens Quay, please use the north sidewalk in this area. Signage will be in place for any required pedestrian diversions.
