CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #1: Queens Quay East Interim Improvements Lower Jarvis Street to Parliament Street

PROJECT SCOPE

A series of interim improvements for pedestrians and cyclists will be constructed in East Bayfront beginning next week. These improvements, which set the groundwork for the full vision for Queens Quay, will consist of surface/ landscaping improvements to the sidewalk area and Martin Goodman Trail on the south side of Queens Quay East between Lower Jarvis Street and Parliament Street. When complete next spring, the interim sidewalk and trail will greatly improve connectivity in East Bayfront and the landscaping will help beautify the area while the new neighbourhood continues to be built out. The tender package for this project has been awarded to Somerville Construction with work split into 5 Zones:

- Zone 1: Lower Jarvis Street to Dockside Drive;
- Zone 2: Dockside Drive to Bonnycastle Street;
- Zone 3: Bonnycastle Street to Small Street;
- Zone 4: Small Street to Parliament Street;
- Zone 5: Parliament Street & Lakeshore Boulevard crosswalk work.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

Pedestrian, bicycle and vehicular access will be maintained at all times with minor diversions as necessary to accommodate construction activities.

LOOK AHEAD: UPCOMING WORK

Zone 1:

- Crews will begin to mobilize during the week of September 2 and expect to start work the same week.
- When demolition work commences, crews will begin by saw cutting the south side concrete curbs and asphalt surfaces. The debris and materials will be removed from site by dump trucks.
- A short stretch of the eastbound curb lane will be closed to traffic using traffic barriers to mark the work area.
- Cycle and pedestrian access will be maintained with alternative diversion pathways provided. Please note that the north-south crosswalk on the east side of Queens Quay at Jarvis will be closed during this phase of construction to allow crews to build a ramp in this location. The crosswalk on the west side will remain open.
- The Queens Quay entrance to Sugar Beach will be closed—access to the park will remain from Dockside Dr.

Zone 3:

- Work will commence during the week of September 17, 2014.
- When demolition work commences, crews will begin the saw cutting of the south side concrete curbs and asphalt surfaces. The debris and materials will be removed from site by dump trucks.
- A short stretch of the eastbound curb lane will be closed to traffic with traffic barriers being used to mark this work area. Cycle and pedestrian access will be maintained with alternative diversion pathway provided.
