



Aitken Place Park Community Update Meeting

Situated in the heart of the new Bayside development, Aitken Place Park is East Bayfront's next waterfront park. Join Waterfront Toronto on Thursday, July 9 for an update on progress of the park's design based on the public feedback we received earlier this spring.

During the meeting, you'll have an opportunity to learn more about the design and programming for this 0.75-acre park, located just east of Lower Sherbourne Street and south of Queens Quay. An amenity for those living in the area, Aitken Place Park will offer opportunities for play and recreation, as well as quiet places to relax and enjoy spectacular views of the lake. There will be a drop-in session where you can view displays and speak one-on-one with the project team. Following the presentation there will be a question and answer session and we look forward to hearing your comments.



A round of public consultation took place in April 2015, when we received feedback from the members of the public about the preliminary design concepts (including programs) for Aitken Place Park. You can read the full report on the public input we received [here](#).

PUBLIC MEETING DETAILS

- Date:** Thursday, July 9, 2015
- Time:** Drop-in and View Displays 6:00 to 6:30p.m. Presentation and Question/Answer Session 6:30 to 8:00p.m.
- Location:** 20 Bay Street, Suite 1310. For access to the building please use the main entrance on the west side of Bay Street, in between Queens Quay and Harbour Street.
- Transit:** From Union Station take the 509 Harbourfront or the 510 Spadina streetcar to the Queens Quay/Ferry Docks stop. Alternately, take the 6 Bay bus southbound from the corner of Front Street and Bay Street to the Bay Street and Queens Quay stop outside 10/20 Bay Street. The entrance to 20 Bay Street offices is on the west side of the street.
- Parking:** Paid parking is available nearby both on Bay Street and on Queens Quay. There are paid parking lots 1 block north at Lake Shore and Bay, 1 block north on Bay Street on the northwest side of Harbour Street and York, and 1 block east opposite Toronto Star building.
- Accessibility:** The 509 Harbourfront and 510 Spadina streetcar stop to Queens Quay/Ferry Docks is located underground and has 46 stairs to street level. We regret that the elevator in the station is currently out of service. The nearest barrier-free transit stop for the 509 Harbourfront and 510 Spadina streetcars is York/Queens Quay. The 6 Bay bus provides accessible service and stops at Bay and Harbour Street. We recommend using the main entrance on the west side of Bay Street, in between Queens Quay and Harbour Street to enter the building.
- Wheel-Trans:** Wheel-Trans drop-off location is on the west side of Bay Street, just south of Harbour Street and north of Queens Quay, located outside the main entrance to 10/20 Bay Street.
