
CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #9: Phase 1A Jack Layton Ferry Terminal and Harbour Square Park

Construction on Phase 1A of the Jack Layton Ferry Terminal and Harbour Square Park project is entering the final phase of construction. Completion is anticipated for early May 2019.

What to Expect During the Final Phase of Construction

The new granite promenade has been completed and will be open for public following fence removal on April 12. Fences and site trailers that are blocking access to the promenade will be removed from site. Site specific fences will be erected around smaller concentrated work areas until all work is complete.

Fences will be erected leading to the Jack Layton memorial statue while the stair handrails are installed the week of April 15, 2019. The walkway leading to the statue, including the stairs, will be closed until after work is complete. The temporary wood guard rail, on the west side of the main promenade at the back end of the underground parking entrance, will be removed and replaced with a new permanent guard rail. A hand rail will also be added along the western walkway. The temporary fences will remain around the perimeter of this area while work is taking place; access to the underground garage will not be interrupted as a result of this work.

Tree planting is anticipated to take place within the month of April as the weather warms up and ground becomes suitable to receive these new plantings. Fences will not be required for this work

Completion

Upon completion, the public realm outside Jack Layton Ferry Terminal will feature a 106 linear metre promenade leading visitors south from Bay Street to the ferry terminal. This promenade features our signature two-tone granite maple leaf mosaic that will unify the entire water's edge of the waterfront. The area will see improved views of the water's edge from Bay Street and illumination for evening users with the installation of light fixtures throughout the park pathways. The newly installed double row of trees along the promenade will also form a natural canopy archway that will enclose the entrance and park paths once trees reach maturity.

Construction of Phase 1A of this project is scheduled for completion May 2019.
