CONSTRUCTION NOTICE: Queens Quay West at York Street & Rees Street Signalization Change

In early February 2019, construction work will commence on signalization changes at the intersections of Queens Quay West at York Street and Queens Quay West at Rees Street. This work will remove existing traffic signal poles and arms, signal heads, and signage.

This existing infrastructure will be replaced by new programmable heads, oversized signage and different length arms overhead traffic lanes. The addition of these new traffic controls will further improve the safe movement of vehicular and pedestrian traffic—particularly for left-turning traffic.

Once work is complete, this new infrastructure will match the current Lower Simcoe intersection, which was upgraded in spring 2016.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION:

Road users should expect minor delays and increased traffic on nearby streets as a result of reduced traffic light functionality. Paid duty officers will be on site while traffic lights are not functional to assist with traffic management and safety of residents, workers, and road users.

In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be local shoulder lane restrictions within the construction work zone to accommodate construction vehicles. Traffic cones and flashing lights will be placed around trucks occupying these shoulder lanes.

Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily commencing in early February 2019. Work is anticipated to take approximately four (4) days (2 days per intersection) to complete; work will be staggered between each intersection.
