**CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #13: Queens Quay Revitalization
Stage One: Week of August 27 to August 31, 2012**

TORONTO HYDRO

With its permit now in place, Toronto Hydro will obtain “locates” between Yo Yo Ma Lane and Yonge Street to identify gas, electrical and other services in and near areas that will be excavated as part of their construction.

BELL

Aecon (Bell’s construction contractor) is scheduled to begin new cable installations for 207 Queens Quay, on Monday, August 27. This work is expected to be complete by the end of the week. New copper and fibre cables will be drawn from the pit which is located in the taxi stand area and is currently covered with a steel plate.

What to Expect:

Aecon will remove the steel plate and perform some additional digging adjacent to this area. Aecon trucks will park and occupy a section of the eastbound curb lane next to the pit.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

Traffic barrels and fast fence will be installed around the work zone. There will be minimal disturbances to pedestrian access as crews will be predominately working from the adjacent traffic lane. Paid duty police officers will be on site as necessary to direct traffic. Taxis will be able to use the dedicated stand and lane at QQT during this work activity.

TTC

TTC crews will continue their work within the Harbourfront Portal. TTC trucks and crews may occupy the track right-of-way and exit/entry ramp area during this work with no disruption to pedestrian or vehicle access along Queens Quay.

LOOK AHEAD: UPCOMING WORK

- Hydro: Locates are expected to continue in advance of preparations for dewatering.
- Bell: The next stage of cable installations is dependent on the progress of the 207 Queens Quay installations. The cabling schedule for the month of September will be communicated next week.
- TTC: Construction and remediation work will continue in the Harbourfront Portal.
