CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #16: Martin Goodman Trail Connection and Jarvis Dockwall

May 21, 2013 to May 24, 2013

Reminder: Monday, May 20 is Victoria Day – there will be no construction activities.

Eastern Construction's sub-contractor – Coco Paving – is nearing completion of the remediation work on the concrete sidewalk between Lower Yonge and Lower Jarvis Streets. This work, which was identified as part of the standard Quality Control Plan review, is required to ensure the sidewalk meets the City and Waterfront Toronto's standards and specifications as set out in the contract. Following these remediation measures, the sidewalk will open in May as planned.

Work also continues on the new signalized intersection at Lower Sherbourne and Queens Quay East. EllisDon crews completed the installation of underground conduits and traffic pole foundations. The placement of new traffic poles is now underway and will continue this week. These signals will allow safe crossing of Queens Quay from the north and south sides of the street.

What to Expect:

Last week, crews completed the reconstruction and concrete pour of the sidewalk segments along the southside of Queens Quay from the Jarvis Dockwall to the west entrance of Dockside Drive. The sidewalk will open when the adjacent dedicated bike lanes have been totally repaved. Last week, crews were able to complete 50% of this work. The remaining asphalt paving of these bike lanes will be completed by the end of this week.

The section of sidewalk east of Freeland and directly in front of the new Pier 27 condominiums was poured and completed last week as well.

The remediation work of the Redpath driveway adjacent to the Jarvis Dockwall was completed last week. This work was required to eliminate some drainage issues in this area.

Minor asphalt patching along the southside edge of the Queens Quay sidewalk, adjacent to the security fence which runs along the length of the Redpath property line will be levelled and patched this week.

Crews are installing granite pavers along the head of the Jarvis Slip.

Some construction and equipment noise can be expected with the minor remediation work that remains to be completed this week.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

Two-way traffic will be maintained along Queens Quay, but some short term lane diversions may be required when crews are working on the final details of sidewalk, bike paths and landscape work. Traffic barrels will be used to mark these localized work areas and their progress along Queens Quay.

All driveways will be maintained during construction. Pedestrian access will be maintained on the northside of Queens Quay with alternative diversion paths marked with signage.

- Granite installation will continue at the Jarvis Head of Slip
