CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #3: Jarvis Dock Wall Reinforcement & Martin Goodman Trail Connection

Week of October 22 to October 26, 2012

JARVIS DOCKWALL REINFORCEMENT

Crews completed a trench along the length of the Jarvis Slip Dock wall to locate and expose existing dock tie-backs (the reinforcements for the dockwall). Over the coming week, crews will remove four trees and the old asphalt within the work zone area which is protected by fast fence.

INTERIM MARTIN GOODMAN TRAIL CONNECTION

The City of Toronto issued construction permits for the project and Waterfront Toronto and Eastern Construction awarded the contract to Coco Paving. Work is currently underway to finalize the construction schedule and work plan. Calls have been placed for utility "locates" along Queens Quay to identify gas, electrical, water, and other services along the work zone. Once these locates have been completed, mobilization for the Martin Goodman Trail surface works will begin.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access:

Minor traffic and vehicle disruptions may occur as heavy machinery is positioned within the work zone and fast fence area. The Queens Quay entrance to Canada's Sugar Beach has been closed with fast fence. Signage has been installed indicating that visitors to the park may enter from the Dockside Drive entrance on the east side of the park.

LOOK AHEAD: UPCOMING WORK

- Jarvis Slip Dockwall: Construction at the dockwall will continue.
- Martin Goodman Trail Connection: Mobilization will begin and construction starting (pending locates)
