CONSTRUCTION NOTICE #17: Queens Quay East Interim Improvements (Lower Jarvis to Parliament)

Municipal Services Work

Construction of the two storm forcemains on the east side of **Parliament Street from Lake Shore Boulevard to Small Street** continues. This forcemain crosses under the Martin Goodman Trail at two separate locations. Crews have now reached the first location, just east of Parliament Street and south of Lake Shore Boulevard. Starting **Friday April 8**, a short section of the Martin Goodman Trail will be blocked off while crews install this section of forcemain.

Cyclists travelling east or west on the trail will be diverted onto the sidewalk on the east side of Parliament Street. Cyclists must temporarily dismount and share the sidewalk with pedestrians. Please refer to this graphic, which shows the construction zone and diversion:

As this work progresses to the southwest, the forcemains will cross Martin Goodman Trail in a second location, requiring a further diversion within the next 1-2 weeks. Additional details about this work and updates regarding lane restrictions and diversions will be circulated as this project progresses.

The entrance to the parking facility at 333 Lake Shore Boulevard on the southeast corner of Lake Shore and Parliament Street will remain closed for the next 1-2 weeks. Anyone requiring access to this property should use the entrance just east of Parliament Street. Pedestrians and cyclists wishing to cross northbound at this intersection are being directed around the construction fencing.

On the north side of Queens Quay East, crews have now finished the installation of the new storm sewer from Bonnycastle to Small Street. They are currently cleaning up and grading the balance of the work zone in preparation for asphalt paving, which is tentatively scheduled for the week of April 22, weather permitting.

ADDITIONAL WORK ON QUEENS QUAY EAST

New driveway at Queens Quay and Bonnycastle

Starting April 7, construction crews working at Hines-Tridel's Bayside development will begin to access this site intermittently via a driveway just east of Bonnycastle Street. When this access point is in use, a flagman will be stationed at the entrance to direct construction vehicles. Signs will be installed alerting cyclists and pedestrians to watch for turning vehicles.

Temporary closure on Bonnycastle Street

Starting Friday April 8, weather permitting, Bonnycastle Street will be closed for several days between Queens Quay East and Lake Shore Boulevard. This closure is related to Great Gulf's ongoing work at the Monde construction site.
