



ONTARIO PLACE REVITALIZATION | CENTRAL WATERFRONT SECONDARY PLAN









ONTARIO PLACE REVITALIZATION | OVERVIEW

- Combined Official Plan Amendment

 Zoning By-law Amendment for the
 three proposals (tenanted areas), led
 by Infrastructure Ontario
- Site Plan Control for the public realm plan, if required (led by Infrastructure Ontario)
- Tenants will be responsible for Site Plan Approvals
- City acting in its usual role as approval authority
- IO, on behalf of Province, is acting as the applicant and project manager

- Design coordination between the EA teams, private tenants' teams and related projects to ensure a holistic and unified review process






ONTARIO PLACE REVITALIZATION | PUBLIC REALM CHALLENGES

- Appropriately scaled public realm relative to proposals
- Coordination between various design teams for Environmental Assessment process, private tenants' sites and related projects to ensure a generous and continuous public realm that is suitable to regional park and cultural destination
- Unique environmental conditions (e.g. wind)
- Ecological preservation (e.g. mature trees, habitat)






ONTARIO PLACE REVITALIZATION | AREAS FOR PANEL CONSIDERATION

Does the initial proposal:

- align with the original Hough/ Zeidler vision?
- creates a coherent, continuous public realm between various proposed programs (yet to be determined), while providing for year-round public realm uses?
- preserves, replaces and improves tree canopy?
- enhances connectivity with City through cycling and pedestrian infrastructure and improves connections to the waterfront park system and Exhibition Place?
- creates a welcoming and freely accessible public experience and addresses equality in the design?
- addresses sustainability, resilience and futureproofing?

- Environmentally sustainable and resilient






This opportunity is about creating something remarkable for all Ontarians

 Centre to explore opportunities for science-related activities in the Pods and Cinesphere.





A Phased, Multi-Partner Approach



Opportunities for Engagement & Input

Public consultant launched following the July 30 2021 announcement of shortlisted tenants. The consultation process is structured around the statutory EA process and its four main public events, as shown below:









Public Realm Design: Objectives + Scope


- Upgrades to the entire public realm at Ontario Place are required to ensure current health, safety and accessibility standards are met.
- Investment in the public realm is required to create a high-quality experience for this important waterfront destination.
- In late 2021, an international RFP process was undertaken to attract a world-class design team to lead the public realm design process.

RFP required the public realm design team to:

- Celebrate the legacy of Ontario Place while reinventing it for future generations.
- Provide continuous public access to the entire waterfront.
- Provide convenient and fully accessible connectivity that meets and/or exceeds AODA standards.
- Resolve flooding issues, environmental remediation and soil management.
- Work with tenants to ensure consistent high quality landscape experience across entire site.
- Recognize and integrate the diverse Indigenous cultures and histories.
- Create a condition that represents and celebrates all Ontarians
- Build on the Ontario Place legacy and focus on upgrading, repairing and modernizing existing conditions across entire site, not wholescale demolition and replacement.

Public Realm Design and Upgrade

Public Realm Plan Objectives

- To modernize the public realm experience and make it accessible for all to enjoy
- To create a unified, cohesive Ontario Place experience that seamlessly integrates tenant areas with government lands

Scope of Work

Above Grade Works

Hard and soft landscaping, lighting, furniture, art installations, small buildings / structures (such as public washrooms), habitat creation, wayfinding.

Below Grade Works

Earthworks (grading), stormwater management, shoreline repairs/flood mitigation, water quality enhancement and waterflow connection

Team Composition

Lead Landscape Architect, Architect, Engineers (Civil, Structural, Electrical, Environmental, Marine, Mechanical, etc.), Ecologist, Indigenous Advisor(s), Certified Arborist, Independent Cost Consultant, Heritage Expert, Wayfinding Expert, Irrigation Specialist, Contract Administrator


