Project Background

- The Destination Playground and Pavilion are located within Promontory Park South. Promontory Park South is being delivered as part of the larger Port Lands Flood Protection project.
- The Destination Playground is unfunded and anticipated to be delivered through philanthropic funding. This project is scalable based on the success of the fundraising initiative
- We are completing 30% schematic design and a phased implementation strategy to support our fundraising efforts.
- The playground was previously reviewed by the Panel (April 2020) in-camera, due to ongoing procurement negotiations with the play design manufacturers


- From July 9 12, 2022 WT and PF&R staff traveled to Tulsa to learn about the Gathering Place
- Meetings were held with a focus on design, operations and fundraising to help gain insight into how we might deliver a Destination Playground in Toronto.
- The following slides provide a summary of some of the lessons learned from the trip



Design Observations Gathering Place, Tulsa Oklahoma

- 7.5-acre Chapman Playground, situated within the 66-acre Gathering Place Park in Tulsa, Oklahoma.
- Opened in 2018, the park and playground draw more than 2 million visitors a year, far exceeding initial projections.
- The \$460M Gathering Place Park was made possible entirely by philanthropy, with nearly 90 individual philanthropic contributions totaling \$210M matched by a \$350M donation from the George Kaiser Family Foundation.
- The Gathering Place has been named as USA Today's Best New Attraction and one of National Geographic's 12 Mind Bending Playgrounds, and an Urban Land Institute Global Excellence Award in 2019






- Reconfiguration of garden rooms and integration of increased landscape elements



Design Review Panel (5/25/2022)


- Appreciated concept of **embedding the building in the landscape.**
- Final buildout of Villiers Island will be a very popular destination with both local and outside visitors
- Consider strategies in crowd control for the pavilion and adjacent open space, especially during popular summer and winter events.
- Consider an interim park access strategy including transit and parking.
- Continue meaningful consulation with Indigenous groups.
- Reconsider the name "Winter Garden" to help clarify its function.
- Consider including a fire pit.
- Ensure the space is flexible and can accommodate seasonal functions to ensure year-round success.
- Consider opportunities in the design that will **highlight the ecological benefits** of the park and the building






Port Lands Park Programming Types - 2024







Circulation Diagram






Northern Play Area Circulation










