

Parliament Slip Lakefill Canada Navigable Waters Act Public Notice

As part of the Quayside project, Waterfront Toronto will extend Queens Quay East to the planned Silo Street, including a new intersection with a realigned Parliament Street. To facilitate this work, the head of Parliament Slip will be filled in.

The Navigation Protection Program (NPP) helps keep Canada's navigable waters open for transport and recreation. As per the <u>Canadian Navigable Waters Act</u>, a 30 day public notification period is required prior to any construction works on Toronto's waterfront slips.

Waterfront Toronto hereby gives notice that an application has been made to the Minister of Transport, pursuant to the Canadian Navigable Waters Act for approval of the work described herein and its site and plans.

Pursuant to paragraph 7(2) of the said Act, Waterfront Toronto has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Common Project Search Registry (<u>http://cps.canada.ca/</u>) under the NPP File Number 2023-409051 a description of the following work, its site and plans: Parliament Slip Lakefill including construction of a new dockwall, lake filling and rock berm for fish habitat in Lake Ontario, Toronto Inner Harbour at the foot of Parliament Street (Lot 26, Registered Plan 694-E, P.I.N. 21384-0105(LT).
