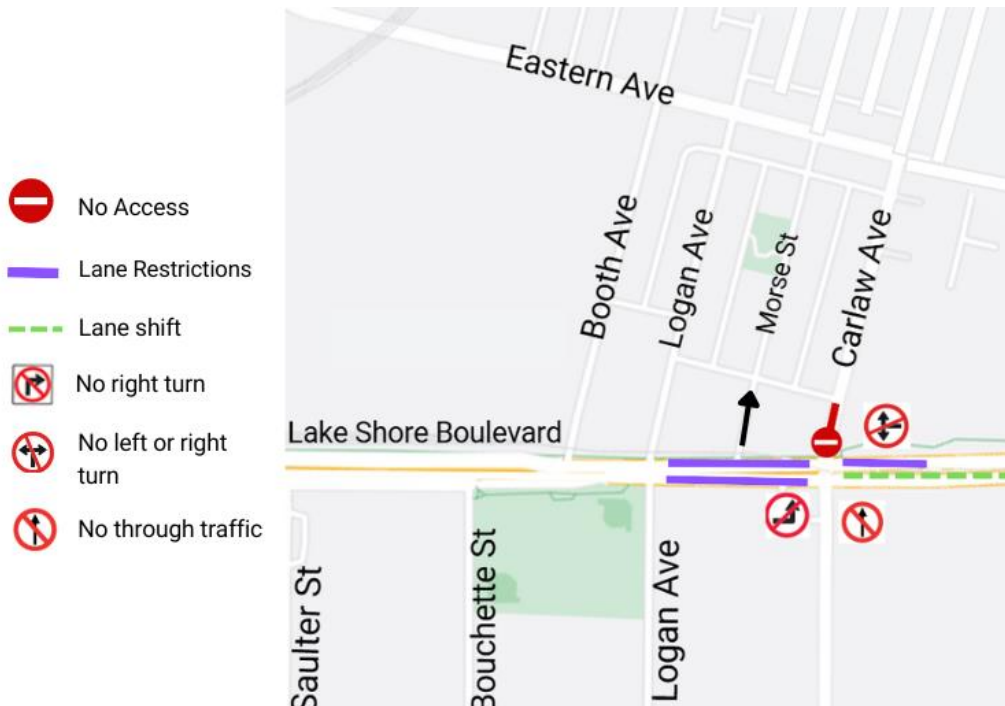
Traffic Notice

Lane Reductions and Partial Intersection Closure at Lake Shore Boulevard & Carlaw Avenue:
Friday, May 30th at 9:00 p.m. to Tuesday, June 3rd at 5:00 a.m.

Lanes will be reduced on Lake Shore Boulevard around the Lake Shore Boulevard and Carlaw Avenue intersection. There will be no access from Lake Shore Boulevard to Carlaw Avenue north of Lake Shore.

This work is part of a multi-phase approach to rebuilding Lake Shore Boulevard between Carlaw Avenue and Don Roadway. Work in this phase includes removing the existing asphalt, pouring a new road base, new paving, and line markings in the intersection.

All work on Lake Shore Boulevard between Carlaw Avenue and the Lake Shore Bridge is expected to be complete by the end of 2025. At the completion of this project, Lake Shore Boulevard will be three lanes in each direction with new landscaping and pedestrian and cycling facilities.

There will be no right or left turn from Lake Shore Boulevard eastbound to Carlaw Avenue north or south bound. There will be no left turn from Lake Shore Boulevard west bound to Carlaw Avenue southbound. Carlaw Avenue

will remain open between the closure at the intersection and Eastern Avenue. Businesses and residences on the block of Carlaw between Eastern Ave and Lake Shore Boulevard will be able to access them via Eastern Ave.

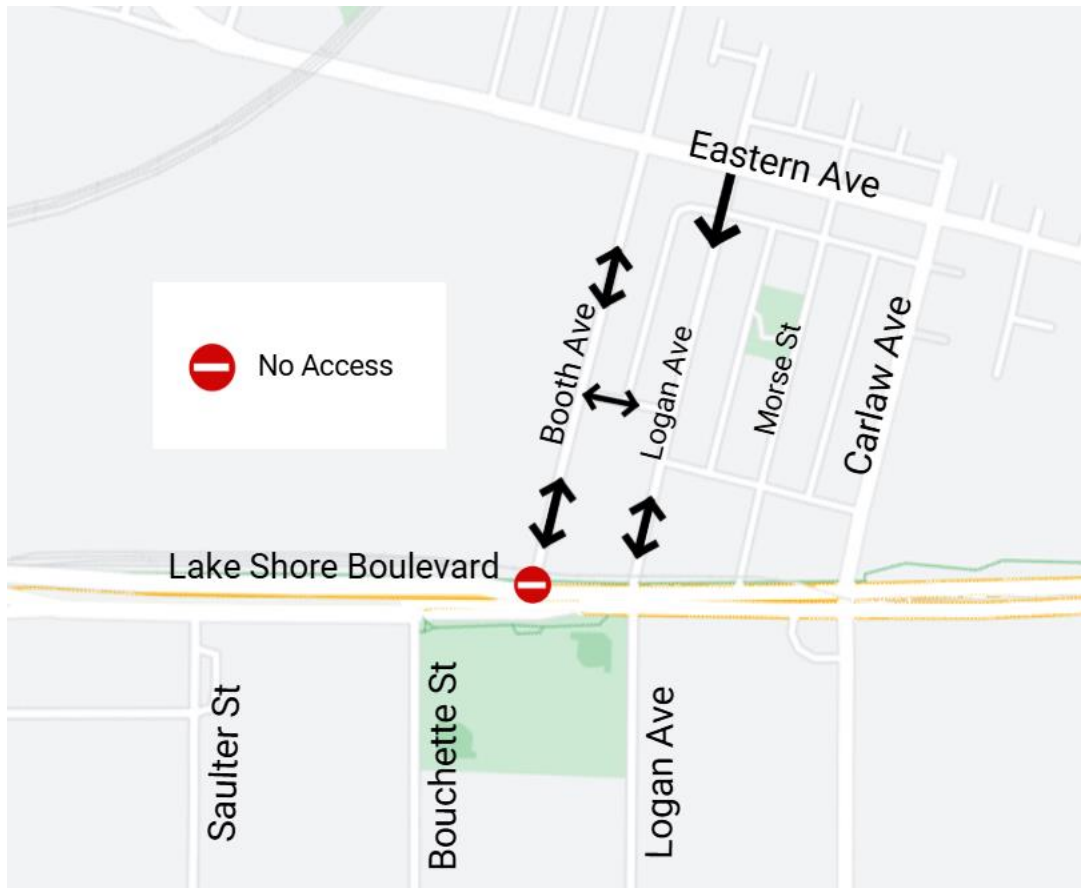
Why are we doing it this way?

- A phased approach allows us to keep traffic moving through the Carlaw intersection as smoothly as possible. The alternative is to fully close the intersection, which would be more disruptive to traffic.

What to expect starting 9:00 p.m, Friday May 30th:

- On Lake Shore Boulevard Eastbound:
 - No left turn on to Carlaw Avenue northbound
 - No right turn on to Carlaw Avenue southbound, busses excepted
 - There will be lane restrictions as it approaches Carlaw Avenue
- On Lake Shore Boulevard Westbound:
 - No right turn on to Carlaw Avenue northbound
 - No left turn on to Carlaw Avenue southbound
 - Traffic will be reduced to a single through lane as it approaches Carlaw Avenue
- On Carlaw Avenue north of Lake Shore Boulevard:
 - No access to Carlaw Avenue northbound from Lake Shore Boulevard
 - No access to Lake Shore Boulevard from Carlaw Avenue southbound
 - Access to Carlaw Avenue between Lake Shore Boulevard and Eastern Avenue will be available via Eastern Avenue. To access Eastern Avenue from Lake Shore Boulevard Westbound, take Morse. To access Eastern Avenue from Lake Shore Boulevard Eastbound, take Leslie.
- Pedestrians and Cyclists:
 - The sidewalk remains closed on the south side of Lake Shore Boulevard East between Carlaw Avenue and Bouchette Street. A detour is in place along Commissioners Street
 - The multi-use trail on of the north side of Lake Shore Boulevard will be temporarily relocated and outlined using concrete barriers.
- All lane closures will be marked with traffic barrels or fencing and paid-duty officers may be on site during the closure and installation of the new traffic barriers.

No Access Between Booth Ave and Lake Shore Boulevard: as early as June 2 for 6–8 weeks

Beginning as early as June 2nd at 5 a.m. for approximately 6-8 weeks, the intersection of Lake Shore Boulevard and Booth Avenue will be closed. To get off Booth Avenue, use Eastern Avenue, or the laneways that connect to Logan Avenue, as shown on the map above. During this closure, we will be completing work such as building curbs, gutters and catch basins, as well as running electrical conduits and installing lighting. What to expect as early as June 2nd:

- There will be no access to Lake Shore Boulevard from Booth Avenue southbound
- There will be no access to Booth Avenue northbound from Lake Shore Boulevard
- To get off Booth Avenue, go north to Eastern Avenue or use the laneways that connect to Logan Avenue
- The multi-use trail along Lake Shore Boulevard will be closed west of Logan Avenue. Pedestrian and cycling access to Booth Avenue will be via Logan Avenue and the laneway.
