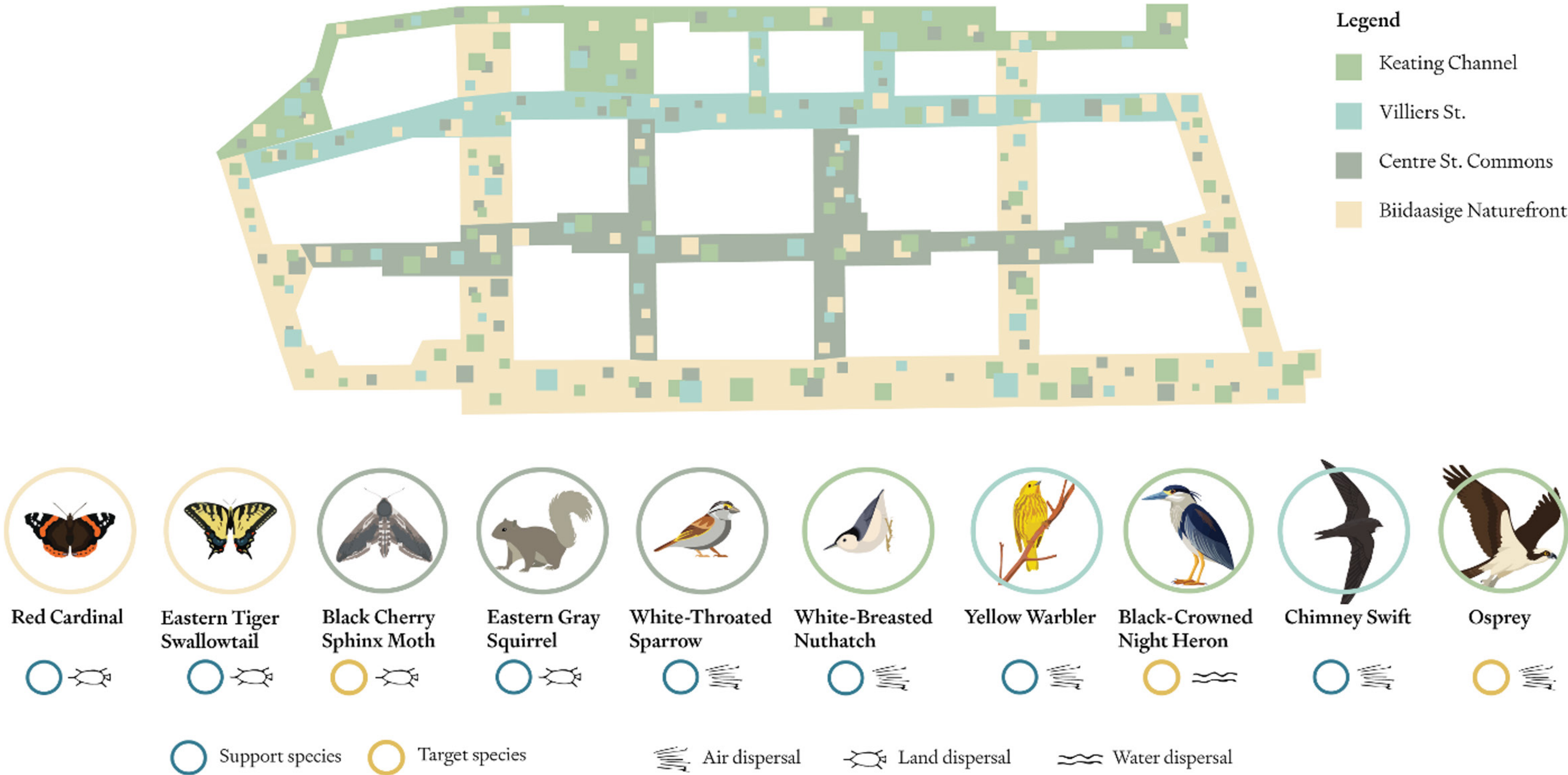


Space for Nature



We are aiming not only for habitat diversity, but a mosaic approach with four main habitat types: Riparian Forest, Broadleaf Forest, Mixed wood Forest, and Savannah–Prairie (Meadow). The mosaic landscape is characterized by connected patches of habitat spread throughout the area—that create a diverse, flexible and interconnected landscape.



We have heard loud and clear that nature is a big priority for this new neighbourhood. We are starting to define in more detail what this could look like, and what that nature - both flora and fauna - includes.
