

Where is Villiers Island?




From an Industrial Quay.....



..... to a New Island Community on Toronto's Waterfront




Villiers Island will evolve from an industrial port to a connected and complete island community with great parks and open spaces along four distinct water's edges.



Precinct Plan Guiding Principles


- 01 Animate and activate the water's edges
- 02 Create a network of **spectacular open spaces** and waterside parks
- 03 Provide for a catalytic opportunity which reinforces the Island as a regional destination
- Reinforce the Island as a gateway to the Port Lands districts
- ⁰⁵ Celebrate the area's **industrial heritage**, **character and legacy** through appropriate conservation
- ⁰⁶ Prioritize transit, pedestrian and cycling infrastructure to, from and within the Island
- Plan for a diverse, mixed-use and inclusive community with a range of affordable and family-oriented housing opportunities
- ⁰⁸ Provide a **variety of building forms** to support a comfortable and inviting public realm, and establish a distinct skyline
- ⁽¹⁹⁾ Develop an innovative model for a **sustainable urban community** and demonstrate excellence in community design



Built Form Principles

- 01 Create a varied and dynamic built form that contributes to the city and Port Lands skyline
- 2 Reinforce distinct character areas and places in the Island
- 03 Contribute to **spectacular and comfortable all-season** parks, open spaces and destinations
- Design the built form to frame and animate streets, parks and open spaces and respond to water edge conditions
- 05 Maintain and celebrate the built, cultural and natural heritage of the Island and surrounding Port Lands
- **06** Showcase views to the water and industrial landmarks
- **Position taller buildings** in strategic locations to optimize proximity to transit nodes, define gateways and frame major open spaces, and create comfortable micro-climate conditions









Character Areas


5 Character areas create a distinct sense of place in the Island, celebrating the island's different natural, historic and urban landscapes



The Keating Channel & Villiers Street

The island's main 'living room' – an interesting place for people to gather, eat, shop and relax along the northern historic edge





ENCIP CHAMP

A channel-side promenade -

with new and historic buildings and a series of water-side cafes, patios and plazas



Villiers Street – a main retail spine with a wide pedestrian promenade along the northern edge







Marina Square – a small-craft boat launch and plaza space at the historic Harbour Commissioner buildings to watch boats and activity along the channel



Old Cherry Street




The historic corridor at the heart of the island, with a mix of old and infill buildings with employment and commercial uses








Community Catalytic Use & Silos Square – with an innovative water garden and industrial-type boardwalks and walkways connecting to Old Cherry Street



Old Cherry Street –

a pedestrian-priority street with historic and infill buildings, repurposed with new commercial and employment uses







Diagonal Plaza - in front of an employment-use building framing views to the Silos and down Old Cherry Street



Harbourside



The island's lively western end – a destination on Toronto's waterfront, anchored by Promontory Park and the Catalytic Use.







Catalytic Use – A large-scale waterfront public use and regional destination to draw people to Villiers Island



Overlook Plaza and Promontory Park – A large waterfront park with a special edge connecting Trinity Boulevard into the park







Promontory Park – Western Point

A place for people to gather and enjoy amazing views across the lake to the city



Precinct Alternate Plan Alternate plan to maintain historic Marine Terminal #35 building





New Cherry Street

The main gateway and point of arrival to the Island, with dedicated Transit and bike lanes and a wide public boulevard. The focus for commercial and employment related activities.

New Cherry Street corridor

 A wide boulevard with dedicated transit, bike lanes and pedestrian space, lined with mid-rise and taller buildings







ALSO DEEL VANOUVER

New Cherry Street Transit Plaza at New Cherry Street and Centre Street – a moment of arrival and pedestrian activity





River Park & Commissioners Street

A transit-focused boulevard connecting into the Port Lands with taller buildings overlooking the naturalized river valley







Commissioners Street – a wide boulevard lined with dedicated transit and cycling and walking pathways along River Park







Buildings lining Commissioners Street and River Park – mid-rise and taller buildings lining the street with views across the river valley



River Park – naturalized park with recreational trails and opportunities to explore the river valley





Centre Street

An intimate residential tree-lined walking street for Villiers residents to stroll through the island







Centre Street, west of New Cherry Street – pedestrianfocused area with a mix of activities and access to Promontory Park



Centre Street –east of Cherry Street, a place for sitting and strolling through the island



Villiers Park



The hub for the local community with an elementary school, playing field and play space





Elementary School – a signature waterfront school along the channel



Kayak and Canoe Launch – a small-boat launch pad to explore the area from the water









Villiers Park – A park for the local community with a playing field and playground
